Vision

About the Comptroller of Maryland:

The Comptroller is one of three independently elected statewide officials in Maryland.

The Comptroller of Maryland is the elected Chief Financial Officer for the state, as well as the revenue administrator and tax law enforcement agency, general accountant for all state agencies and universities, and regulator of the state's motor fuel industries. Additionally, the Comptroller serves on various state boards and commissions, including the Board of Public Works and the Maryland State Retirement and Pension System.



Priorities

Implement critical agency-wide improvements to help our state government work better

- Right-size the agency, including reorganizing the leadership structure, to provide greater accountability, internal oversight, and success.
- Invest in our workforce from increasing positions, salaries, and training opportunities to improving the physical work environment to ensure that we can recruit and retain high-performing and dedicated team members who feel valued and supported while also being positively challenged to do this important work
- Modernize technology across the agency so that all Maryland residents and businesses, as well as state agencies, can interact more efficiently with the Office of the Comptroller and access our services, data and other resources with ease
- Foster a culture of belonging throughout the Office by embedding our core principles of inclusion, diversity, equity, and accessibility in decision-making, policies and practice



Priorities

Ensure that resources and expertise of the Office create opportunity for and make positive impact on Maryland families, communities and businesses

- Use technology to increase transparency around state spending and the state procurement process, including payments to state vendors and contractors
- Ensure that the Office is using data to drive decision-making, and use the data generated or accessible by the agency to create reports that inform policy decisions both internal and external to the Office of the Comptroller
- Engage in robust public engagement to better connect families, communities, local governments, and businesses across Maryland with the agency for assistance with services, including: filing taxes, accessible tax credits, obtaining legal guidance, setting up payment plans, and more, while also ensuring that the Office continues to develop new resources as needed by the public.
- Responsibly steward our tax dollars through improved oversight, data transparency, and targeted outreach and engagement to increase state procurement with our minority business enterprises and small businesses.



Priorities

Ensure Maryland is well-positioned for responsible long term economic growth and success.

- Modernize and simplify Maryland's tax collection process
- Enhance equity in tax administration by analyzing data on audits and uptake of various tax credits (among other factors) by various populations
- Work to close the wealth gap and invest in disadvantaged communities through targeted procurement programs, efforts to diversify asset managers within the pension system, expanded free tax preparation services, and more
- Evaluate climate impact and sustainability of state spending and investment
- Support the development of responsible and equitable investment policies and practices
- Analyze the well-being of Maryland's economy and revenue structure on a regular basis and clearly communicate economic and fiscal trends to audiences across the state




What it will be able to do?

Maryland Tax Connect launched on February 6, 2024. Below are some key statistics so far.

PIN letters generated – 703,625

Maryland Tax Connect Sign ups – 137,000 users

Business tax returns filed – 183,000

Business tax payments received – 80,000



Non-Registered - Key Features or Guest Options

- Register a Business in Maryland with CRA Wizard
- Maryland SUTEC application Wizard
- Guest File options available for filing SUT, Withholding and A&A returns. What is needed to file as a guest?
 - ✓ Business FEIN, Business Name and Account type.
- Guest Pay options are available for paying existing liabilities.
 What is needed to pay as a guest?
 - ✓ Business FEIN or CRN and Billing Reference Number.

Registered User - Key Features

- Taxpayers are encouraged to register as a Maryland Tax Connect User once they have received a PIN letter.
 - ✓ Add Authorized Users.
 - ✓ View account summary, filing history and balances.
 - ✓ Files business tax forms.
 - ✓ Make payments on account balances and existing liabilities.
 - ✓ View correspondence (Last 12 months).
 - ✓ Renew Motor Fuel, Slot Machine License and SUT exemption certificates.
 - ✓ Submit a Service Request (upload documentation or request general information).



Registration Types:

Who can register for a Maryland Tax Connect account?

- 1. **Business Administrators** Business owners or anyone responsible for overseeing the business operations and/or finances. These users are required to enter their FEIN and a unique PIN generate out of RPE. PINs are mailed to business taxpayers.
- 2. **Authorized Users** A third party responsible for handling the businesses tax matters (CPA, Attorney, Consultant, etc.) The third party is required to provide their User ID and registration confirmation number to the business administrator. The business administrator with then grant access.
- 3. **Government Agencies** Government parties can complete compliance checks for businesses. Before the government user can access Maryland Tax Connect, this requires approval from the internal team responsible for handling compliance check.
- 4. **Bulk Transmitters** Vendors who file bulk Withholding and Sales and Use tax filings. This will also be used for W2/1099 bulk submissions in January 2025.



- IFTA Waivers Decal Requirements Waived Temporarily for Trucks Transporting Freight to and from the Port of Baltimore. IFTA licensees must file on or before June 30, 2024 to be granted this relief.



Tax Incentives and Credits



Business Tax Credits:

- Tax credits are an amount that taxpayers can claim on tax returns to reduce the amount of tax they owe.
- There are a range of tax credits available for individuals and businesses, and all are processed by the Office of the Comptroller.
- To qualify for some, you might need to receive pre-approval from the department or agency administers the credit.
- For tax years beginning after December 31, 2012, you must file your tax return
 electronically in order to claim a business tax credit unless you submit a waiver from
 the electronic filing requirement. To request a waiver from filing the Form 500CR
 electronically, you must submit a completed Form 500CRW Waiver Request For
 Electronic Filing of Form 500CR and it must be attached to Form 500CR in the filing
 of your return.

Refundable vs. Nonrefundable tax credits:

Some tax credits are refundable. If a taxpayer's tax bill is less than the amount of a refundable credit, they can get the difference back in their refund. Some taxpayers who aren't required to file may still want to do so to claim refundable tax credits. Not all tax credits are refundable, however.

For nonrefundable tax credits, once a taxpayer's liability is zero, the taxpayer won't get any leftover amount back as a refund.

There are a wide range of tax credits, and the amount and types available can vary by tax year. Taxpayers should carefully review current tax credits when preparing their tax return.


